MMTC Salutes FCC Chairman Ajit Pai for His Leadership

WASHINGTON, D.C. (November 30, 2020): Today FCC Chairman Ajit Pai announced that he will be leaving the agency on January 20, 2021. As Deputy General Counsel, a Commissioner, and Chairman, Ajit Pai has displayed commendable respect for science and economic analysis, for governance transparency, and for the highest integrity. His door was always open to those of us in the non-profit sector. He did not shy away from initiatives that benefitted people of color, such as moving EEO enforcement to the Enforcement Bureau, a step he actually announced the day of the 50th anniversary of the EEO Rule. Chairman Pai also resurrected the Advisory Committee on Diversity and Digital Empowerment and assigned it a broad spectrum of issues to review.

The Multicultural Media, Telecom and Internet Council wishes Chairman Pai the very best, and hopes he will stay close to the world of media, telecom, and broadband regulation in the public interest.
