## MMTC Supports the Biden-Harris Administration's Internet for All Initiative

**WASHINGTON, DC. (May 17, 2022):** MMTC supports the Biden-Harris Administration's Internet for All initiative, a \$45 billion investment that will build internet infrastructure, teach digital skills, and provide necessary technology to ensure that everyone in America – including communities of color, rural communities, and older Americans – has the access and skills they need to fully participate in today's society. The U.S. Department of Commerce's National Telecommunications and Information Agency (NTIA) will administer and implement the Internet for All initiative. Also, the NTIA launched three Notices of Funding Opportunity: 1) Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program (\$42.5 billion); 2) Enabling Middle Mile Broadband Infrastructure Program (\$1 billion); and 3) State Digital Equity Act program (\$1.5 billion).
