MMTC Files Comments on FCC's Proposed Pre-Scripted Alerts for Emergency Alert System Messages

WASHINGTON, DC (April 5, 2024): On April 5, 2024, the Multicultural Media, Telecom and Internet Council (MMTC) filed comments on the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) proposed set of pre-scripted alerts for the Emergency Alert System (EAS) messages in English and other commonly spoken, non-English languages.

MMTC President and CEO Robert Branson stated that "MMTC commends the FCC on its comprehensive proposal to improve access to lifesaving information during and the immediate wake of an emergency. MMTC recommends the inclusion of two important ways of ensuring the widespread reach of critical emergency information. First, we recommend the designation of an EAS participant in each market to provide non-English alerts during an emergency. Second, we recommend the FCC move toward requiring live operators and speakers. Pre-scripted alerts are an important tool in meeting the needs of a multilingual population but cannot account for the inherent unpredictability of emergencies."
